## **Abstract of Paper and/or Poster Session**

Despite increasing and widespread access to more information, finding published research, studies and literature in the field of education and psychology has become more complex. This paper/presentation demonstrates how to access published literature in various formats, including books, journal articles, conference proceedings, media, websites, reports, studies, statistics and laws. The author identifies key online databases (found on the “hidden web”), where to find them and how to use them. Key Internet resources, including government, organizational and commercial websites, are recommended. The paper includes tips for target searching, guidelines for evaluation of search results, and how to best utilize electronic and contemporary libraries in a public, school or academic setting.
